- As mentioned at the last meeting we intended to provide a warning period for the first few weeks for residents to adjust to having police presence. You will see in the statistics below that has been the case.

- Several days you had two cars out
- Village Initiated Complaints:
  - Multiple complaints were raised about a male subject possibly being a sexual offender living in a barn in the rear of 152 Oak St. I was able to make contact with him a few days after the first complaint. He is in fact not a sex offender. He denies living in the barn and from what I could see through the open door it appears to be a workshop that he states he spends most of his free time in to stay out of the house.
  - An abandoned motorcycle was removed from the village right of way via impounding with Barber's Towing. The residents do not own it nor care for it being there. It was tagged and then towed days later.
  - Another disabled vehicle was tagged on Mulberry @ Marietta St. The flat tire was fixed, the expired tag was not, however it has since been moved from the street.
- We have fielded several complaints from residents pulling up to us wanting police to do something about minor children operating ATVs, motor bikes, and other higher speed motorized devices on the residential streets that are operating recklessly in their opinion. In each case we patrolled the area and did not locate and juveniles on motorized vehicles. These complaints came during the unseasonably warm weather as of late.
  - Does the council have a preferred method for handling this matter? I wasn't sure if the village had a newsletter or ability to add notes to water bills, etc. to warn residents of this problem.
